

Pain Management: CPA and Reassessment

Comprehensive Pain Assessment

Completed:

- 1) On admission for ALL patients
- 2) At 1st complaint of pain during an assigned nurse's shift for inpatient

Includes 6 Components:

1. Numeric Pain Rating
2. Tolerable Pain Level
3. Pain Location
4. Pain Quality
5. Pain Type
6. Functions Impacted by Pain

◇ Pain Type
◇ Functions Impacted by Pain
◇ Non Pharmacological Interventions
◇ Intervention Able to Improve Function

If patient is unable to self-report, then complete a behavioral pain assessment.

Reassessment

Reassessment of pain/POSS to be done **within 60 min.** of an intervention

Pain Assess alert will show for **non-opioid** pain medication
(Alert will turn orange when overdue)
