EMS Operations Reminder

Under the structure of the Illinois EMS Act, EMS is licensed by agency and by vehicle, there is no opportunity to work independently of that structure. As summer activities begin, multiple organizations reach out for EMS coverage for their event, either by insurance requirement, perceived need and/or past history. These requests can only be taken by EMS agencies who are responding with a licensed vehicle and the required personnel for that vehicle, individuals cannot fill this role. Agencies do have the ability to modify the licensure level of the vehicle through submission of a Special Event Form, but only within the licensing options of the system and IDPH. Any time an agency is contracting outside of their normal response area, a Special Event Form should be completed.
