

Long-Term Post-Op Complications

SYMPTOMS OF GALLBLADDER DYSFUNCTION

(one or all symptoms may occur)

- Symptoms may occur after eating
- Nausea/vomiting
- Fever
- Bloating
- Right upper quadrant abdominal pain, epigastric pain, back pain and/or right shoulder pain

If symptoms occur, patient should call to follow up with medical provider.

INTERNAL HERNIA SYMPTOMS

(one or all symptoms may occur)

- Changes in bowel habits
- Nausea/vomiting
- Bloating
- Left upper quadrant pain, typically worse when lying flat and may improve when leaning forward

If symptoms occur, patient should contact medical provider immediately or seek emergency medical attention.

ULCER SYMPTOMS

(one or all symptoms may occur)

- Epigastric pain
- Nausea/vomiting
- Bloating
- Heartburn/ reflux

If symptoms occur, patient should contact medical provider for further work-up and treatment.

STRICTURE SYMPTOMS

(one or all symptoms may occur)

- Dysphagia (difficulty swallowing food/drinks)
- Heartburn/reflux
- Regurgitation of food or liquids

If symptoms occur, patient should contact medical provider for further work-up and treatment.
