WHEN I NEED OPIOIDS, HOW CAN I USE THEM SAFELY?

- O Use the smallest amount possible for the shortest amount of time.
- Never take more medication than prescribed.
- O Never mix alcohol with pain medications.

HOW SHOULD I STORE OPIOIDS?

- Keep out of reach of children or pets.
- O Hide or lock up your medication.
- O Keep your medication in its original bottle or container so you do not take it by mistake.
- O Keep track of the location and number of pills in the bottle.
- In the event of an unintended overdose or poisoning, call Poison Control at 800–222–1222.

HOW SHOULD I DISPOSE OF OPIOIDS?

- O Get rid of unused opioids as soon as you no longer need them.
- O Find a drug take-back program or verified prescription location to get rid of them.
- O Improper disposal of opioids can result in poisoning, substance abuse or contamination of water resources.
- Opioid drugs should not be flushed down the toilet or poured down a drain.
- O Do not give your pain medicines to a friend, family member or stranger.
- O See your physician if you are in pain.
