EMS Provider Certification Requirements Reminder

Required certifications, listed below, must remain current to function as an EMS provider in both the DMEMS and SMEMS Systems. It is the EMS provider and EMS agency's responsibility to track these and stay current. Should a provider expire, it is their responsibility to notify their EMS office in writing for next steps.

EMR and EMT:

- CPR

Advanced EMT, Paramedic, PHRN:

- CPR
- PALS, PEPP, or ENPC
- ACLS
- PHTLS (TECC after initial PHTLS), ITLS, TNS, or TNCC

Updated agency rosters should be submitted along with the NT inspections. Rosters must include: Name/level of each provider, phone #, email, license # and license expiration date.


