Taylorville Memorial Hospital Completes Construction on "A Hospital for Decades to Come"

Crews completed the second and final phase of a three-year hospital modernization project regarded as both an improvement to Taylorville Memorial Hospital and a long-term investment in the community.

"Taylorville Memorial Hospital has served our family, friends and neighbors in Christian County for more than 100 years," said Kim Bourne, president and CEO of Taylorville Memorial Hospital. "We believe in providing innovative and patient-centered healthcare, and this modernization project demonstrates our continued commitment to provide the people we serve with a state-of-the-art hospital for decades to come."

Construction crews broke ground in June 2018 on a two-story, approximately 97,000-square-foot building that would replace most of the former hospital, a five-story structure built in 1954, on the current hospital campus at 201 E. Pleasant St.

Throughout the project, leaders sought ways to honor the past. The Sacred Heart of Jesus statue donated to the hospital by employees in 1958 found a new home in the courtyard. Stained-glass windows originally in the chapel were painstakingly restored by preservationists with Emil Frei & Associates of St. Louis and moved to a place of honor near the new dining area.

"Our investment in the people of Christian County and its nearby communities continues with our updated focus on quality, safety and convenience for everyone we serve," Bourne said.

The modernization project was completed in two phases to ensure continuity of patient services during construction and to have minimal impact on newer portions of the hospital that were updated in 2011.

"Growing for Generations" Campaign Accepts First Gift of Grain to Benefit Christian County

Area farmers can donate bushels of grain to the Taylorville Memorial Foundation Growing for Generations Cift of Grain program.

The foundation accepts donations of bushels of grain in any amount to support the hospital's mission to improve lives and build stronger communities through better health.

Farmers transfer ownership of grain directly to the foundation by designating Taylorville Memorial Foundation as the recipient of bushels of grain at any local elevator. Because the grain is donated, the farmer avoids the sale of the commodity as income, which provides tax savings.

"Given our service area is located in the heart of the corn and soybean belt, gifts of grain are a unique way to make a charitable gift that may appeal to donors," said Raedena Ryan, executive director of the Taylorville Memorial Foundation. "Using grain to make a gift is an easy way to invest in the future of local healthcare."

Taylorville Memorial Foundation uses the gifts of grain and other generous contributions to provide educational grants for current and aspiring healthcare workers, support patient care services, medical technologies and population health initiatives in local Christian County communities.





Donation Helps Fund Mammogram Monday Program

A fundraising campaign held by G.Y.M. (Get Yourself Motivated) fitness facilities in Taylorville (also in Pontiac and Washington) supported Memorial Health breast cancer patients. The fundraiser at G.Y.M. helped provide free breast cancer screenings at Taylorville Memorial Hospital during the hospital's Mammogram Mondays initiative in October.

"At G.Y.M., making healthy life choices is close to our hearts," said Kiley Megrant, manager of Taylorville G.Y.M. "When we found out Taylorville Memorial Hospital has a program that helps uninsured or underinsured women get their yearly breast cancer screening, it was the perfect fit for us."

The fitness facilities raised \$1,200 through T-shirt sales and donations from clients and employees. A check was presented to the Taylorville Memorial Foundation. The donation helped seven women receive a potentially lifesaving screening.

Each October, Taylorville Memorial Hospital provides free breast cancer screenings for women who are uninsured or underinsured as part of Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Taylorville Memorial Foundation provides funding to cover the cost of the mammograms.

The National Cancer Institute recommends that all women age 40 or older have screening mammograms every one to two years. Breast cancer is the second leading cause of cancer death among women in the United States.

Community Donates Meals as Gesture of Support to Frontline Healthcare Workers

"It's empowering to see how people want to support our colleagues," said Emily Bailey, director of clinical operations at Taylorville Memorial Hospital. "The generosity of McLane Company and other groups and organizations with their gifts of meals, snacks and encouragement provided such a timely pick-me-up for our colleagues during a stressful time. Their gestures of support meant the world to us."





Donors to Medical Technologies Fund Provide Two Disinfection Systems to Taylorville Memorial Hospital

A gift from two local donors has supplied the Taylorville Memorial Hospital Environmental Services department with additional disinfection systems.

Jim and Deb Stoddard have supported the Taylorville Memorial Foundation with donations since the foundation's formation. The couple's most recent gift supported the purchase of two Clorox Total 360 Electrostatic Sprayers and a handheld unit to enhance cleaning and sanitizing efforts at Taylorville Memorial Hospital.

The Clorox Total 360 is a new revolutionary system that helps reduce pathogens. After initial cleaning of the room and surfaces, the Clorox Total 360 is an added step to ensure disinfection of hard-to-reach places along the sides, undersides and backsides of certain surfaces.

Jim Stoddard operated Stoddard Foods in Assumption until his retirement. Deb Stoddard served as surgery manager at Taylorville Memorial Hospital for many years until her retirement. She is a long-time member of the Taylorville Memorial Hospital Auxiliary.

"The Stoddards' gift also provided additional equipment dedicated to Acute Care and the OR," said Raedena Ryan. "Gifts that support the medical technologies fund allow us to make investments in state-of-the-art medical equipment critical to providing exceptional patient care for our community."

Katie McCarty Nursing Fund Supports Nurse's Certification as a Manager Leader

Missy Keiser, BSN, RN, CNML, manager of TMH's surgery department passed her Certified Nurse Manager Leader (CNML) certification exam. This certification given by the American Organization for Nursing Leadership validates a nurse manager has the knowledge and essential elements to perform at a high level in a nursing management and leadership position.

"This certification helps validate competence and is just another way to let others know you know what you are capable of doing," said Eli Heicher, TMH director and chief nursing officer. "This is something to be extremely proud of and is just the start of increasing certification and education levels at TMH."

Community Health Grants Address Health Needs in Christian County

The Taylorville Memorial Foundation (TMF) launched a board-directed grant program to assist with funding health-related projects in Christian County.

The foundation will award grants to local nonprofit 501 (c)(3), education or government organizations to support community health activities. The grants committee on the foundation's board of directors will review and choose grant recipients who meet qualifications.

"Engaging like-minded organizations in our community to collaborate and help support our mission is an opportunity to expand our footprint and improve the lives of our neighbors," said Raedena Ryan, executive director for TMF. "This exciting development in local philanthropy is possible through a strong legacy of board governance and generous donors."

Applications will be accepted on a rolling basis. A completed application and a detailed budget must be submitted for review and recommendation to the Taylorville Memorial Foundation Board Grants Committee for funding approval.

Mental Health First Aid Course Offered

Mental health was identified as a leading concern in the 2015 and 2018 Community Health Needs Assessments. In response, Taylorville Memorial Hospital began offering Mental Health First Aid training to the public. Mental Health First Aid is a nationwide program that teaches people to recognize the signs of mental health issues and connect those affected with the help they need. The program also aims to reduce the stigma and raise awareness of mental health concerns. In partnership with the Illinois Association for Behavioral Health, the Taylorville Memorial Foundation covered the costs for eleven individuals who participated in virtual Mental Health First Aid—Youth through Operation Snowball, Inc.

Mental Health First Aid—Youth is an interactive, eight-hour certification course that presents an overview of mental illness and substance use disorders. The course introduces participants to risk factors and warning signs of mental health problems, builds understanding of their impact, overviews common treatments and teaches a five-step action plan to help a young person in crisis connect with appropriate professional, peer, social and self-help care resources.

Safe Passage Program

A Taylorville Police Department program that connects Christian County residents suffering from addiction with treatment facilities received an \$18,400 grant from the Taylorville Memorial Foundation.

Safe Passage, launched in 2019 by the police department, was funded solely by donations, prior to the foundation's grant allocation.

The program includes two on-call coordinators and a team of volunteer drivers who transport clients to inpatient treatment centers, as well as an aftercare program that allows clients to meet weekly at the police department to support their recovery through group discussion.

"Our Safe Passage program has a 40 percent success rate with our clients, and crime in our city is reduced as residents who were committing crime, such as theft, to fuel their addiction become sober," said Taylorville Police Chief Dwayne Wheeler.

Clients suffering from addiction who come to the Taylorville Memorial Hospital Emergency Department for medical treatment are frequently referred to the program, said Wheeler. The grant is the first to be issued by the foundation as part of its Community Health Grant Program. The Taylorville Memorial Foundation launched its board-directed grant program to assist with funding health-related projects in Christian County earlier this year.



Grant Supports Gold Star Families in Illinois

A central Illinois group that honors the memory of fallen Illinois service members through an annual bicycling trek and education scholarships for Gold Star families was awarded a grant from the Taylorville Memorial Foundation.

The Gold Star Mission, a nonprofit organization formed in 2017 by current and former military members from Illinois, received a \$1,000 Community Health Grant approved by the nonprofit hospital's foundation grants committee.

The grant supports the organization's annual Gold Star 500 endurance event—a five-day, 500-mile bicycle trek that raises money to assist with education scholarships for Gold Star family members and associates. The Gold Star Mission has issued 164 scholarships in the names of fallen Illinois service members since 2017.

"What better way is there to preserve and honor our nearly 300 fallen service members than through scholarships," said Eric Murray, director of operations, Gold Star Mission. "These scholarships, named in honor of fallen Illinois service members, assist Gold Star families and help others, thus preserving the fallen service member's name forever."

In addition to the Community Health Grant, medic bag supplies were donated by Taylorville Memorial Hospital. Members of the hospital's nursing enrichment team traveled from Taylorville to Pawnee as medic relief for a nurse volunteering on the ride in honor of her fallen son.





Foundation will help provide safe housing for Christian County residents in recovery from addiction or in mental health treatment.

Living Recovery Residencies is a collaboration between local landlords and the Christian County Prevention Coalition. The program provides housing for people before the Christian County Problem-Solving Court, which consists of drug court and mental health court.

"The individuals who live in our Living Recovery Residencies homes are expected to follow rules and guidelines consistent with recovery programs and with problem-solving court," said Sue Paso, therapist with Sue Paso Counseling, who spearheads the program. "They are provided a home environment that is safe from people and settings that trigger drug use or crime. This environment is conducive to recovery. For example, clients are subject to random drug testing and home inspections."

Jason Domonousky, a case manager with Paso Counseling, will provide monitoring and assistance to residents in the program.

"Living Recovery Residencies is a tenant case management program in which our clients are supported by trained professionals who will help them learn how to live a healthy life and restore them as contributing members of our community," Paso said. Housing for the Living Recovery Residencies program is on East Franklin Street, where a renovated apartment complex will house program participants.

Organizers continue to seek funding from groups involved in community health to sustain the program after its initial launch, said Paso. The Community Health Grant from TMF helps provide up to seven residents with rent and living support while they participate in the court-ordered treatment and recovery program in which they are enrolled.
